Wind Speed:

In 1805, Sir Francis Beufort, an admiral in the British Navy, came up with a system for describing wind speeds at sea. This scale is called the Beufort Scale and it uses the numbers 0 - 12. The higher the number, the faster the wind speed.

- 0 Calm (under 1 mph miles per hour)
- 1 Light Air (1 2 mph)
- 2 Light Breeze (4 7 mph)
- 3 Gentle Breeze (8 12mph)
- 4 Moderate Breeze (13-18 mph)
- 5 Fresh Breeze (19-24 mph)
- 6 Strong Breeze (25-31 mph)
- 7 Near Gale (32-38 mph)
- 8 Gale (39 46 mph)
- 9 Strong Gale (47 54 mph)
- 10 Storm (55 63 mph)
- 11 Violent Storm (64 72 mph)
- 12 Hurricane (over 74 mph)
- * The U.S. weather service also uses the numbers 13 17 for winds of hurricane speed! #
